Who can apply for CSP?

CSP is suitable for undergraduates and graduates from a wide range of courses, including, but not limited to:

- Education
- Science

- Humanities
- Health and social care

We're looking for someone with:

A **passion** to work in education and the **confidence** to lead a class of around 30 students.

- Varying levels of experience. Classroom-based or specific school-related experience is not required.
- A **commitment to undertake the virtual and face-to-face** training sessions, supported by industry experts.

Availability to complete a paid placement in a school.

Readiness to start working as a Cover Supervisor with us on completion of the programme.

One of our dedicated recruitment experts will **discuss the training with you and your suitability** for the programme.



You will need to complete **three** online training modules covering safeguarding and behaviour management.



We'll invite you into branch to complete an additional face-to-face training session for guidance on what to expect and how to shine in the classroom.



How our Cover Supervisor Programme works

You'll **complete a paid in-school placement** in one or multiple settings (depending on availability), to help you gain valuable classroom experience.



On completion of your training, we will **obtain a reference** from your placement school(s).



Once we've received satisfactory references and completed our safer recruitment checks*, **you'll be ready to work for us as a Cover Supervisor** and potentially secure a long-term or permanent position.



What to expect in the classroom

- Leading a class of children and young people following a pre-set lesson plan.
- Whilst you're not expected to be a subject specialist, you'll be delivering classes across a range of subjects, particularly if you're working in a secondary setting.
- Effectively managing behaviour and creating a positive learning environment for pupils.
- Accurately recording attendance and providing a thorough handover for the class teacher.
